Controlled blasting – Johns River area

The NSW Roads and Traffic Authority (RTA) has formed an alliance team with Thiess Pty Ltd and Parsons Brinckerhoff Australia Pty Ltd to design and construct the 33 km dual carriageway upgrade of the Pacific Highway from Cooperook to Herons Creek. The project includes new bridges and bypasses of the towns of Moorland, Johns River and Kew. The project is jointly funded by the NSW and Australian Governments.

About controlled blasting

As part of this project, controlled blasting will occur along cuttings in sections of the existing Pacific Highway and bypasses between Johns River and Kew. The purpose of the controlled blasting is to assist in the removal of hard rock to enable the highway earthworks to be completed.

About 60 blasts will be required on this project. The program of blasting is expected to take about six months. There will be a maximum of one blast on any given day between 9pm and 3pm. Affected residents will be notified prior to the blast.

Johns River area – controlled blasting

The first controlled blast will occur along the Johns River bypass alignment of the Pacific Highway approximately 800 metres south of Stewarts River Road. **The blast will occur on Wednesday the 16 January 2008 between 2.15pm and 2.30pm, weather permitting.**

Exclusion zone

Careful consideration has been given to blast design and quality control to prevent fly rock damage to people and property during the blasting process. Government guidelines require that an exclusion zone be established and maintained for each controlled blast as an additional safety measure. The exclusion zone is the area surrounding each controlled blast (typically a distance of between 300 and 500 metres) and must be clear of all people at the time of the blast. Alliance engineers have defined the exclusion zone and property owners within this zone will be contacted by a representative of the Alliance team to make appropriate arrangements during the blast.

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Traffic effects

For safety reasons, traffic will be stopped for up to 5 minutes during routine blasting operations while more complex blasts may extend to 15 minutes in some circumstances.

Traffic changes for blasting are advertised as part of our quarterly construction updates in newspapers, and on electronic signs in advance of the area.

The Alliance will work closely with the community to ensure every practical and feasible measure will be undertaken to minimise any impacts on the nearby residents and maintain safety. We have enclosed an information sheet to provide you more information about controlled blasting.

The alliance apologises for any inconvenience this work may cause and will undertake every practical measure to minimise the impact on the residents and the environment.

Construction hours

Construction work hours will be Monday to Friday from 7am to 6pm and Saturday from 8am to 1pm. Nearby residents will be advised of any construction work to occur outside normal working hours.
